In its existence of almost 73 years, Dinabandhu Mahavidyalaya has been braving odds with unrelenting determination while remaining steadfastly dedicated to its prime objective of imparting true enlightenment to young minds.

Established in 1947, the watershed year of Indian history, Dinabandhu Mahavidyalaya boasts of an illustrious past with its origin inseparably linked with three of the most eminent sons of the soil of early twentieth-century Bengal, Dinabandhu Mitra, Bibhutibhushan Bandyopadhyaya and Rakhaldas Bandyopadhyaya. Aims and Objectives

- 1. To enlighten the pupil and, even more importantly, to help them in their holistic development into responsible citizens and exemplary human beings.
- 2. To sustain its education-friendly inner ambience and make it increasingly conducive towards imparting true enlightenment.
- 3. To establish a friendly rapport and healthy camaraderie between teachers and students.

- 8. To make students proficient in public speaking and also to generate in them an aptitude for academic research in their favourite areas by holding students' seminars at regular intervals.
- 9. To provide students the necessary relaxation and entertainment, through indoor games, gymnasium facilities, etc.
- 10. The help learners who cannot conform to the conventional educational routine, to pursue their ambition for higher studies through the various centres of distance learning available in the college premises.

Rules and Norms

Discipline

In addition to the normal conduct and decency expected from all students, students are to pay special attention to the following:

- 1. Students must obtain their identity cards after admission. They must carry their identity cards with them and must produce the same wherever needed and whenever asked by the security personnel. (The loss of the Card must immediately be brought the attention of the Principal. A new identity card can be obtained on payment of Rs. 50.
- 2. Students must conduct themselves with dignity and maintain the necessary decorum as well as decency regarding clothes and behaviour.
- 3. Students must be respectful towards teachers and all other members of the staff of the college as well as to fellow and senior students.
- 4. Students must maintain respectful silence while inside the library and also while walking down the corridors.
- 5. Students must not indulge in smoking or in any other unpleasant and impermissible activity in the college premises.
- 6. Students can get their documents attested by the Principal from Monday to Friday between 2 pm and 3 pm through the office. They must carry originals of the documents to be attested.
- 7. Defilement of the premises and ambience by way of putting up posters and / or indiscriminate spitting and littering is strictly prohibited.
- 8. Cycles and motorbikes must be parked in the cycle-shed constructed exclusively for this purpose beside the entrance to the main building, and not on corridors or any other place within the premises.
- 9. Students must observe the notice board everyday to remain abreast with the latest notifications and updates.

Attendances in Lectures

- 1. Students are expected to attend all classes within the college hours on each day as scheduled in the routine of their respective departments / disciplines and must meet the minimum requirements as stipulated by the West Bengal State University in this regard.
- 2. As per guidelines laid down by the University, a student must attend **at least 75%** of the classes held in each subject, in order to be considered 'regular'. A student attending above 60% but less than 75% of the classes shall be declared 'non-collegiate'. A student who attends less than 60% of classes shall be declared 'dis-collegiate' and shall not be allowed to appear in the University examination.
- 3. Promotions and permissions to appear in the University examination are subject not only to satisfactory record or work but also regular attendance in lectures, tutorials, and practical classes as well as the fulfillment of all other relevant preconditions as specified by the University.

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Dinabandhu Mahavidyalaya, Bongaon

The college offers three-year Honours courses in Arts/Humanities, Science and Commerce. The honours courses, leading to Bachelor of Arts/Science/Commerce, is open to all who have passed the Higher Secondary Examination (10+2) of the West Bengal Council of Higher Secondary Education or other equivalent examinations recognized by the West Bengal State University. A candidate should qualify in the five recognized subjects at the 10+2 level including a full paper in English (full marks not less than 100) in order to be eligible to apply for any of the courses. For lab-based subjects, a candidate must secure pass marks separately in theory and practical papers.

NET Coaching

This coaching, meant for postgraduate students of Bengali, is not limited to students of the college and is open to all students of the same discipline from the vicinity and the entire district. This coaching aspires to equip students adequately for facing the NET, through lectures given by distinguished faculty invited from other colleges and universities.

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Cultural Activity

The college encourages various cultural activities like quiz competitions, debate, drama, musical performances which are held around the academic session. Several new talents emerge from these cultural exchanges. Special programmes are arranged on the occasions of the birthdays of Rabindranath Tagore, Bibhutibhushan Bandyopadhyay, and other momentous figures from the realm of literature and culture as well as on dates of historical significance, e.g. *Bhasha Dibas* and others. Apart from these, the Students' Union organises a major annual inter-college fest.

Seminars, Workshops, and Students' Seminars

This institution understands that restricting the teaching-learning process to mere textbook-bound and conventional modes of classroom teaching can never lead to successful imparting of education. Hence, the various departments of the college organise seminars and workshops at regular intervals in which resource persons from various institutions of the state are invited to deliver their well-versed views. These exposures to new ideas and thoughts keep the teaching faculty updated and, at the same time, result in the enrichment of the students. Apart from these, intra-department students' seminars are regularly organised which provide students with a platform to voice their own views while giving them confidence to speak in public forums.

The Library

The library, one of the proudest possessions of the college, is a rich repository of knowledge with more than 18,000 printed books, like the *Encyclopedia Britannica* (1985 ed.) - 19 vols. *Micropaedia* - 10 vols., *Human Anatomy*, etc. apart from e-books and journals. Alongside entitling students to a huge posse of valuable books that are now out of print, the library provides photocopying facilities and access to the Internet. The library is computerised using ILMS Soul-2.0. Users can access the digital database which includes 13000+ entries. The central library now has 15228 text books, 2806 reference books, 74 Braille books, 15 CD's and DVD's, printed journals along with 6000+e-journal tiles and 31,35,000+e-book title to be accessed online with the N-LIST registration.

Library Rules

The library adheres to some strict rules which are as follows:

- i) Hours of operation: 10:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. (Monday to Friday) & 10.30 a.m. to 2.05 p.m. (on Saturdays).
- ii. Students-members are lent a maximum of 2 books at a time for a period of 15 days. Faculty members are lent a maximum of 5 books at a time for a period of 30 days.
- iii. Members must produce their library card on entering the library while borrowing books and journals and whenever demanded by the library staff.
- iv. Backpacks, bags, umbrella, lunch boxes and other personal belongings must be deposited at the entrance.
- vi. Every members must sign the Register available at the entrance.
- vi. A non-member student can also use the library material in the premises of the library,

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- subject to the permission of the Librarian. An external or casual student can use the library with prior permission of the Principal.
- vii. Readers should never mark, underline, write, dog-ear and / or tear pages or damage library documents in any manner.
- viii. Silence, decorum, and discipline must be maintained in the library.
- ix. Usage of mobile phones is strictly prohibited in the library premises. Mobile phones must be kept in silent mode inside the premises. The member shall not make any call from the library premises and / or make use of the phone in any other manner. In case of an absolutely urgent incoming call, the member concerned must step outside the library premises to receive the same.
- x. Smoking, eating, sleeping, and talking loudly and disturbing others in the library are strictly prohibited.
- xi. Newspapers and magazine must be read only in the library on the specific tables and should not be taken to any other reading area.
- xii. No library material and / or property should be taken out of the library without permission.
- xiii. Books lost must be replaced.
- xiv. Members may reserve books by filling up the stipulated demand slip from 10.30 a.m. to 4.00 p.m. on working days. The reservation will be valid till 4.35 p.m. on that day.
- xv. Anybody found violating the abovementioned rules would be liable to lose the privilege of library membership.
- xvi. The Librarian, with approval of the Library Committee, reserves the right to add, delete, alter or modify any of the above rules as and when deemed necessary.

The Library Database: The library has also extended its acquisition and service towards ICT-based resources. The library has INFLIBNET (N-List) facility for accessing 97000 and more e-books and above 6000 full-text e-journals.

RTI Cell

In accordance with the Right to Information (RTI) Act, 2005, enacted by the Parliament of India, the college has constituted its own RTI Cell with the aim to make its functioning as transparent and accountable to all as possible.
