Add on Course On REVISITING GANDHI Department of Political Science Dinabandhu Mahavidyalaya Session: 2019-20

Course Objective

1. The Proposed course aims to acquaint student with **Gandhi's** life and role in different ways both during his lifetime and after his death. The study maps out an objective assessment of Gandhi's ideas and work, to draw upon his temporal and historical significance in the context of multiple challenges of our contemporary times.

2. To generate awareness about the high ideals of love, compassion, self-sacrifice, ahimsa, generosity and justice that Gandhi practised in his personal life and that became global values

3. Gandhi was a pioneer in the realm of consciousness. Everything he did was an experiment in expanding the human being's capacity to love, and as his capacity grew, the demands on his love grew more and more severe, as if to test what limits a human being can bear. But Gandhi had learned to find a fierce joy in these storms and trial... By the end of his life he was aflame with love."

4. To ignite within the young minds the Gandhian mantra of 'full effort is full victory'. To quote Gandhi, 'you need not be troubled if you have made mistakes, or if

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your ideal has slipped away. Just continue to give your best... Nothing in life is more joyful or more thrilling. The effort alone brings a continuing wave of joy in which every personal problem, every suffering and humiliation, is forgotten."

5. To pass the spiritual legacy of Gandhi to all learners. Gandhi, who always claimed he had no more than ordinary capacities, is proof that spiritual laws do work, and that by obeying them we can transform our character and consciousness. Gandhi belongs to our own century and faced many of the problems we ourselves are facing today, and even though dead, he still continues to give new direction to our civilization."

Course Outcome

- 1. Working Process- The students may associate themselves with governmental and nongovernmental organizations working on the dissemination of Gandhian values and thoughts.
- 2. Professional Knowledge -Gandhi's profound insight reminds us that true prosperity arises from **diligence**, **integrity**, **and ethical labour**. When wealth is acquired without genuine effort, it can lead to imbalances, social injustice, and moral decay.
